## FODD MATTERS

### 2019-2020 ANNUAL REPORT

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This final transition year for Food Matters Manitoba was one of anticipated change, unexpected challenges, incredible feats of teamwork, new and renewed partnerships, and undeniable optimism.

We partnered with 96 agencies to deliver programs in 95 communities in Manitoba.

- Beyond Our Plate in Southern Health-Santé Sud health region, engaged over 100 youth in imagining possibilities for food security in their communities.
- 25 community food production and land-based projects in 13 communities in Northern Manitoba connected with over 1,000 youth participants.
- The Brandon Food Council entered its second successful year and is now nurturing new relationships with John Howard Society and Brandon University to deliver an innovative pay-what-you-can meal delivery service and food recovery program: Everyone Eats.
- Our Food Our Health Our Culture program wrapped up. We are currently compiling and revamping these resources to meet the emerging needs of our partner agencies.

Covid-19 created new food security challenges and exposed the weaknesses in our food systems. Thankfully, at the outset of the COVID-19 pandemic, we were already working to engage partners through web-based projects and online capacity-building. We are well poised to continue to offer strong leadership, program supports, quality resources and valuable connections address new challenges in the coming year.

I look forward to working with the Board of Directors of Food Matters Manitoba over the next year to leverage their fresh ideas and skills and the momentum of our programs towards a renewed vision and strategic direction for the organization.
